Program Summary

In 2020, Freewheelin' Community Bikes worked diligently to make programming safe for youth. Programming was put on pause from late spring until the summer while we consulted with Covid researchers and medical staff to create a safer plan for re-opening our program spaces.

As a result, all class sizes were reduced, Green Apron/Earn-A-Bike was redesigned to a completely outdoor program, and symptoms were monitored daily. Sanitization, social distancing, and community care became regular conversations with staff and youth. With this new world, Freewheelin' moved forward, providing similar programming, bikes for beginning bike mechanics, and smiles as any other year.

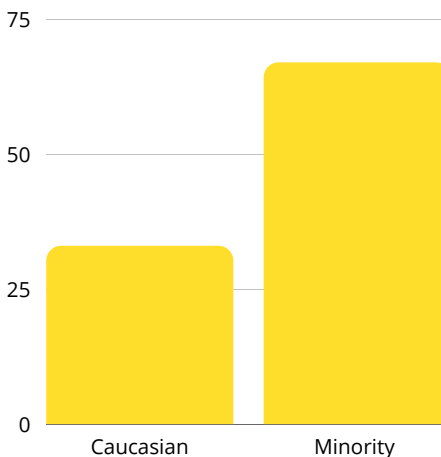

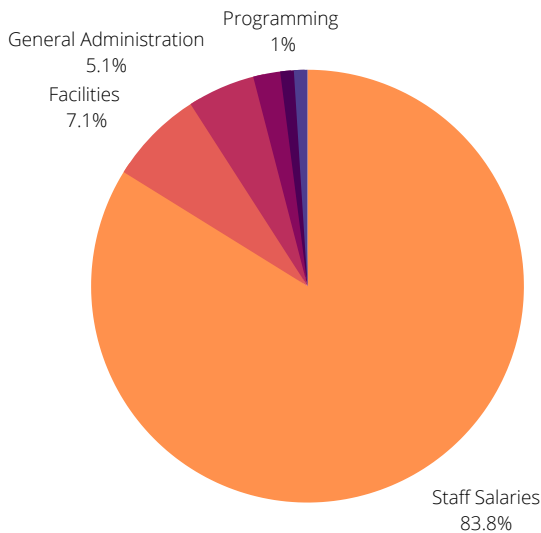
Special Events

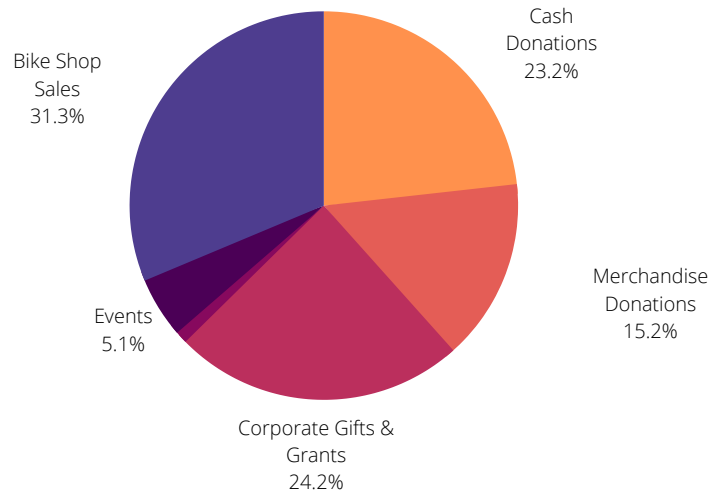


2020 Freewheelin' Bikes Financial Data
